In 1860, Georgia's slave population had ballooned to some 462,198 which constituted 44 percent of the state's total population.

between 1882 and 1930 More than 450 documented lynching occurred in Georgia alone... How many were un-documented?

One of those lynching was Leo Frank, a northern Jew who in 1913 had moved to Atlanta to manage a pencil factory and was accused of murdering a 14-year old girl named Mary Phagan of Marietta.

The Supreme Court ruled in favor of the eugenicists in Buck vs. Bell (1927). Justice Oliver Wendell Holmes speaking for the Court, wrote, "three generations of imbeciles are enough". Between 1937 and 1970, an estimated 3,300 Georgians were legally forced to undergo sterilization surgery.

They owned, rented or insured slaves. Loaned money to plantation owners. Helped hunt down the runaways. Some of America's most respected companies have slavery in their pasts, and we have posted their names on our website. Most of the named companies have a presence in Georgia, and if they can "make amends", Georgia must do likewise. On June 13, 2005, The U.S. Senate apologized for inaction on lynching

“The cornerstone of the confederacy rest upon the great truth that the negro is not equal to the white man, that slavery, subornation to the superior race, is his natural and moral condition.” Alexander Hamilton Stephens (Georgia), Vice President of the Confederacy (1861)
